August 18, 2007 we will have *Doug Thompson* demonstrating the turning of hats. The hat is turned from a roughly 55 pounds of very green half log. The finished hat would weight about 7 oz. In order to turn super thin uniformly, he is using the light shining through wood from behind (inside the hat) to gauge the thickness. After finish, he is going to allow the hat to dry in a stand to form the shape. For those who don't want to do a full size hat, we can use the same technique to scale down to do a mini size hat or turn something super thin for piercing.

The regular meeting of BWWT was called to order by Ben Fix. All members were welcomed to the meeting and the club auction that would follow. Several visitors from Medina and Jackson Twp Ohio were introduced as well as one new member.

The President gave us a list of upcoming events that will impact our club. He stated that in August we would have Doug Thompson demonstrating the turning of hats. This would consist of very thin turning from a 55 lb. block of wood. His demo will take most of the morning and part of the afternoon. In Sept. we will have Jim Burrowes presenting an all day turning event. He will demonstrate two part hollow forms and then offset turnings.

On Sunday, following the regular Sept. meeting, we will have the annual club picnic at the Cuyahoga National Park, north of Akron. All members are requested to bring a dish to the gathering. In October, we will have King Heiple demonstrating tulip candlesticks.

This will be from an article that he wrote in AAW magazine. In November we will have Bill Grumbine demonstrating turning bowls, the use of skew chisels, and the McNaughton System He will also present an all day hands on program for \$40 to those that are interested.
