BWWT Meeting August 13, 2016 Camp Y Noah

The following items were discussed at the regular meeting of BWWT on Saturday, August 13, 2016.....

1. President Rohr welcomed all the members as well as any new guests to the meeting.
2. Pres. Rohr proceeded with the name tag drawing for the membership.
3. Treasurer Mark Stransky indicated that our designated money for outside demonstrators has been spent down to about \$500. He stated that we needed to update the account so that we could plan ahead for future demonstrators to come to our regular meetings to put on a demonstration of what they turn. He said that it costs usually in the area of \$1000 per day for hiring a nationally known wood turner. That would include transportation costs, lodging, meals and incidentals for the demo. He indicated that we needed about \$2500 to be taken from the general fund and placed in the demo fund so that we can begin a search for next years demonstrators. Brian Kuryn made a motion that we move \$2500 from the general fund to the demonstrator fund to pay for future demonstrator costs. This motion was seconded by Kim Ambrose. The question was called for and a vote was taken. It was unanimously in favor moving the money from the general fund to the demo instructor account.
4. Mark Stransky, treasurer, stated that the Annual BWWT Auction was a huge success. We did set a new record of dollar amount taken in from the sale. It was also noted that Ray Marr and his wife Diane made all the food for the lunch at the auction. Then after the sales were complete, they donated the total money to the club treasury.

5. Mark Stransky noted that there had been members who have been asking about the new Parfix CA glue with longer set up and drying time. He said that we need 12 orders to complete the minimum purchase requirement. He requested that those who want to order the Parfix CA glue, should contact him during the meeting. He said that the costs would be \$30 for an 8 oz bottle and \$9 for a 2 oz bottle.

6. Pres. Rohr stated that copies of the changes to the club bylaws are now available for the members. Members were instructed to pick up a copy of the changes to the bylaws and look them over in the coming month. He said that a vote on adopting the new bylaws will be held in Sept. 2016. Some of the changes that will be completed with the adoption of the bylaws are that:

- a. Adjustments will be made to our insurance program,
- b. A member will no longer need a membership in the AAW to be a member of BWWT.
- c. We will need a website co-coordinator to work on our new website
- d. A change of executive comm.. spending amounts from \$200 to \$500
- e. A \$750 insurance payment
- f. Executive comm.. adjustments.

7. Pres. Rohr reminded the membership that in November we will have an election of officers for the 2017 calendar year. He noted that we will need an educational coordinator that can cover the Wed. night campers turning session as well as coordinate the Turn and Learn Sessions.

8. Pres. Rohr indicated that today's demo will be on box joints and the presenter will be Hoby Horn.

9. The demonstration for the Sept meeting will be Marty Chapman on Hollow Turning.

10. Pres. Rohr stated that Joe Herrmann will present the Oct. demo.

11. The membership was reminded that our meeting for Nov will be the third week instead of the second week, due to a large group of people visiting the camp grounds. It was noted that this will be the same weekend as the Hartville Hardware Tool Sale.

12. Pres. Rohr stated that we are still in need of a demonstration for the month of Dec. Anyone interested should contact Pres. Rohr as soon as possible.

13. The administration of Camp Y Noah has reminded the executive committee to mention to our members that we are not to park on the grass but only in the graveled lanes or roads in the camp ground. We are to park in the main parking lot or other overflow lots at the front of the camp. We are allowed to park in the lanes in front of Kastner Hall and limited to the elderly and those bringing equipment to the meeting. **STAY OFF THE GRASS.**

14. Letters of Appreciation are being sent to several members of our club who have helped in meaningful ways in the organization and administration of our club.

15. George Raeder gave a small presentation on the Wooster Center for the Arts in Wooster Ohio. BWWT, along with the Northcoast wood turning club, will be submitting some of our turnings for the show. They will be on exhibit at the show from Sept 12 to Oct. 18. We have been participating in the show for about 8 years. There will be three judges to evaluate the projects and entries. The Buckeye Wood Turners are to submit their turned projects by Sept 10. All entrants are required to have an assigned no. from George. The judging will be on Sept. 12, the show will open on Sept. 16, the Wooster Show party will be on Sept. 22, and the show will close on Oct. 18. There will be 10 categories for members to enter their projects. The following categories will be judged: Plain Platters, Decorated Platters, Vessels, Vases, Plain Bowls, Decorated Bowls, Boxes and Lidded Containers, Spindle Turnings, Segmented Turnings, Sculpture and Misc. Any first place winners from last year, will not be allowed to enter a piece in the same category this year. All projects must have been made from Jan.1, 2015 to July, 2016. It was noted by George that there will be 90 to 100 pieces submitted for the show. Bill Gougler has been selected as the feature artist from BWWT. Congratulations Bill.

16. We had the Tool Giveaway drawing and there were 8 winners. The next tool giveaway will at the Nov. meeting.

17. It was noted that we needed Exec. Comm. approval for the next tool giveaway.

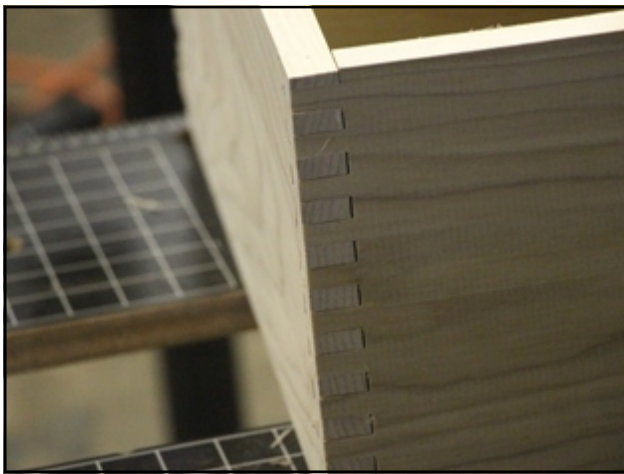

19. It was noted that any auction money we accumulated during the year went to pay for the demos during the year and any of the clubs needs for putting on the meetings.

Hoby Horn....Box Joints Aug. 13, 2016

Hoby stated that box joints are much stronger than the dove tail joints that many woodworkers use to make their drawer corners.



He said that this principally comes from the simple fact that you have more gluing surface available to hold the joint together. He used a Box Joint Jig Guide to hold his drawer sides vertically. He cut the box joints in a fixed router. He used a Porter Cable bushing set that can be purchased at any well equipped hardware store. The router bit that he used in the



router was a 3/8" end mill. The jig was constructed so that it fit the bushing. The holding jig also held a metal pin that was considered a locator pin. The purpose was to bump the drawer panel up to the pin, push the jig and drawer panel into the router bit to make the first cut of the end mill.



{ It should be noted here that all panels should have a small groove cut into the bottom interior edge to accept the drawer bottom when it is slid into position after everything is glued up.} Then reset the drawer side panel so that the new cut will fit over the pin, then make the second cut. Then by placing the second cut on the pin, you can make the third cut. By successive procedures you can make all the cuts on the panel with the same process. He said that you should set the height of the 3/8" end mill just a little higher than the thickness of the wood. This will allow the joint to be put together with a slight protrusion of the joint fingers along the exterior portion of the panel when glued up. That can easily be belt sanded off for a very smooth looking drawer. It was also noted that the pin size should be slightly smaller than the cut size of the router bit. This will allow the panel to easily be moved from one slot to another. It was also noted that the drawer panels should be laid out as to how they are to be put together. Then when you want to cut the next end, all you have to do is flip the drawer panel straight over. Do not flip the panel left or right to do the other end. The finger joints will come out incorrectly. If one would desire, it is possible to cut the panels, two at a time, but one would need some way to hold the panels securely to each other, so that they do not slip. This might result in using masking tape to hold the pieces together for the cuts. When finished making all the cuts on the set of four drawer panels, the panels should slip together with a rather tight fit.

One may have to use a rubber hammer or a wooden mallet to set each corner.



Before the drawers are glued together, one should cut off the bottom edge of one of the panels that will be to the back of the drawer. This is to allow the drawer bottom to be slid into position after the drawer parts have been glued up.

Hoby Horn.....Christmas Tree Ornament August 13, 2016

To make the Christmas tree ornament, Hoby started with a blank of maple that was about 2.5 inches square and about 5" long. He rounded over the corners and squared off the end of the blank.



He used a 3/8" bedan with a recess grind.



He drilled a small hole into the end of the blank that will eventually be for inserting an eyelet, once the ornament is complete.



He then cut a dovetail tenon onto the end of the blank so that he could set the blank into some dovetail jaws. He then removed the blank and reversed it into the dovetail jaws of the chuck.



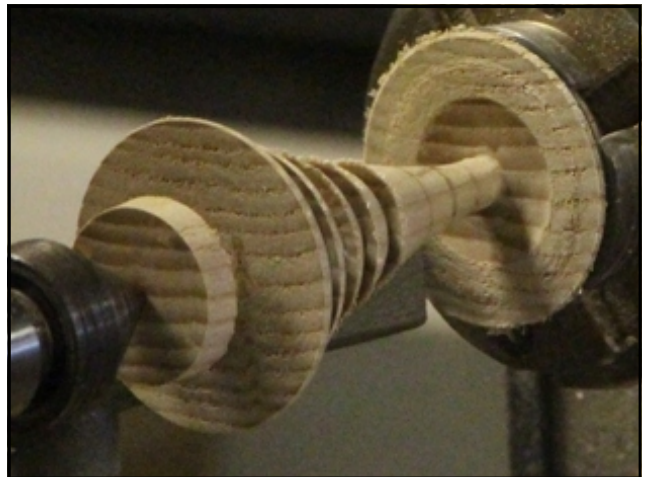
After reversing the blank he noted that the top of the tree ornament will be at the head stock of the lathe. He used the bedan to cut the bottom or base of the tree and clean up the bottom. He cut to the center or "trunk" of the tree with a 3/8" parting tool or bedan. As one is progressing to the top of the tree in the layout, the trunk should become more narrow. Hoby indicated that one should watch for catches, because that will mark up the piece.



He then cut the "branches" into the side of the blank. He used a parting tool to cut each of the limb profiles.



He said that he may use a Dremel tool to design the leaf profiles and then later come back with a wood-burning tool to emphasize or cut the grooves deeper. He stated that people love to receive these near the holiday season and it will bring a smile to their faces.
